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Independent Study Title Barriers to Evidence - Based Nursing Practice as Perceived by Professional Nurses in Medical Units, Uttaradit Hospital

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ABSTRACT

Evidence-based practice has become increasingly important to health care delivery system as it contributes to the best quality of nursing and its outcome. However, professional nurses found a number of barriers in implementing evidence-based practice. The purpose of this descriptive study was to examine the barriers to evidence-based nursing practice as perceived by professional nurses. The population were 60 professional nurses working in Medical Units at Uttaradit hospital. Data were collected during September 2006. The instrument used was the questionnaire modified from the Barriers to Evidence-based Nursing Practice Scale (BEBPS) developed by Chontawan, Nantachaipan, & Thongchai (2006). The content validity index (CVI) of the questionnaire was 0.92 and the Cronbach's alpha coefficient of the BEBPS was 0.89. Data were analyzed using descriptive statistics.

Results of the study indicated that the overall mean score of the barriers to evidence-based nursing practice as perceived by professional nurses was at a moderate level. When considering the subscales, the mean scores of 3 subscales: nurse, organization and evidence were also at moderate levels. The top 4 barriers were: on-site computers were inadequate; on-site data-base was inadequate; nurses had difficulties in reading English research articles and research report/evidence were not readily available.

The findings of this study could be used as background information for hospital administrators and nurse administrators in minimizing barriers to evidence-based nursing practice in order to promote quality of nursing service and to achieve the vision and goals of the hospital.



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
