

Thesis Title Motivation-Maintenance Factors and Practice of Hospital Accreditation
Among Nurses at Srisungwal Hospital

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ABSTRACT

Motivation and maintenance factors are important for successfully implementing both quality nursing care and hospital accreditation process. The purpose of this research was to study the level of motivation factors, maintenance factors, and practice of hospital accreditation and to describe the relationship between motivation factors, maintenance factors and practices of hospital accreditation among nurses at Srisungwal Hospital. Subjects consisted of 180 nurses. Research instruments consisted of Motivation Factors Questionnaires, Maintenance Factors Questionnaires and Practices of hospital accreditation Questionnaires, all developed by the researcher. Data analysis was determined by using descriptive statistics and Pearson's product moment correlation coefficient.

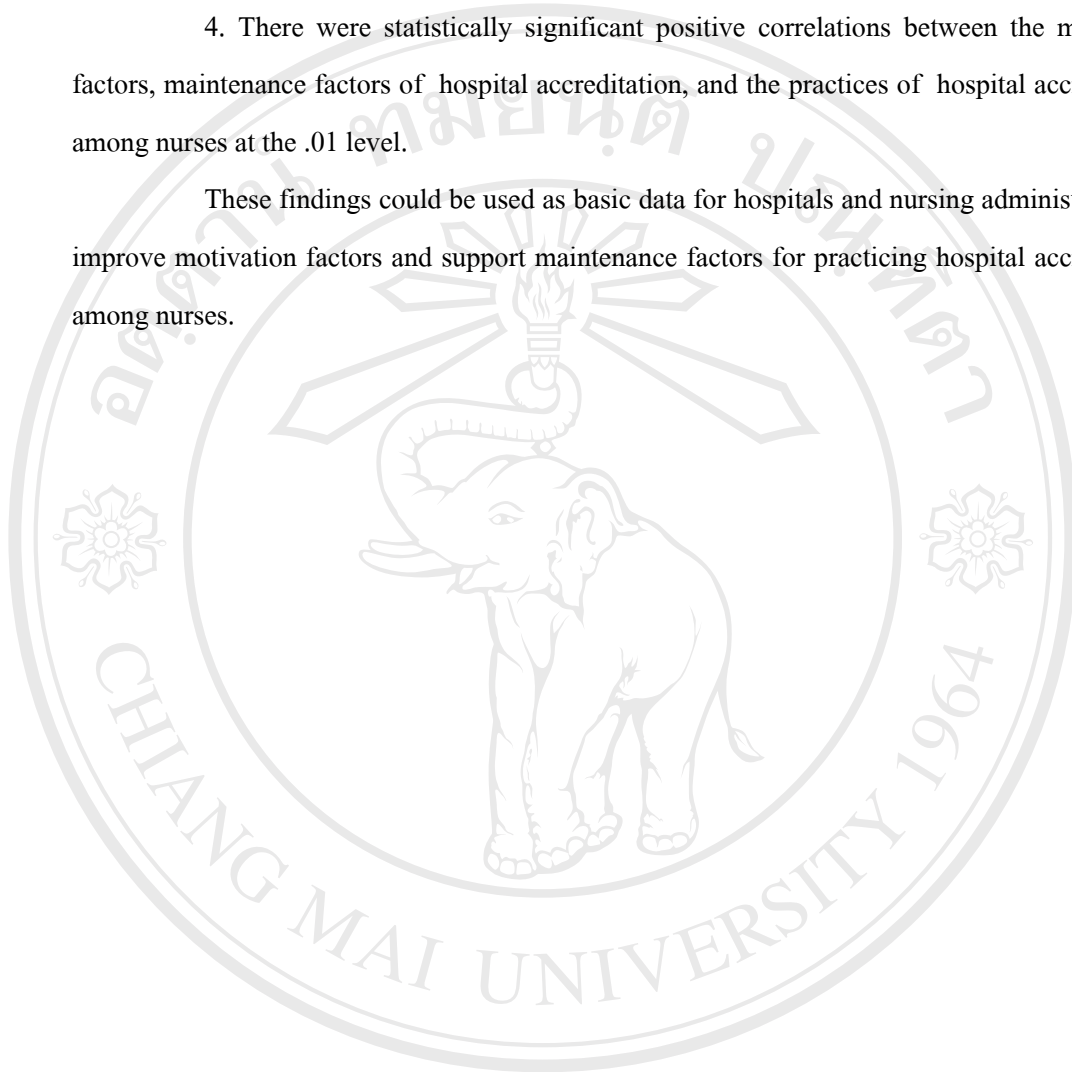
The results revealed:

1. Motivation factors of the hospital accreditation among nurses at Srisungwal Hospital was at a high level,
2. Maintenance factors of the hospital accreditation process among nurses at Srisungwal Hospital was at moderate level,

3. Practices of hospital accreditation among nurses at Srisungwal Hospital were at moderate level, and

4. There were statistically significant positive correlations between the motivation factors, maintenance factors of hospital accreditation, and the practices of hospital accreditation among nurses at the .01 level.

These findings could be used as basic data for hospitals and nursing administrators to improve motivation factors and support maintenance factors for practicing hospital accreditation among nurses.



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
